Electronic Health Information

Export Patient electronic health information may be exported for an individual patient and/or for a group of any or all patients within the system. The export is provided in two electronic formats:

- Basic USCDI data is provided in XML format in CCDAs architecture
- Other PHI is provided in standard CSV (Comma-Separated Variable) format. Each record includes one or more fields with a row for data description and one or more rows for data. Where one or more files are generated in a single “ask”, the files are provided as a ZIP archive containing those files. ZIP files can be opened and extracted using a variety of free products, including WINZip, 7-Zip, etc.

Cantata Health Solutions is committed to continual updates of the CCDAs format to meet the current HL7 Clinical Document Architecture standards as set forth at:

Costs:

A software license is required either through an initial license agreement and ongoing maintenance costs or by way of a SaaS model with ongoing subscription costs.



There is a one-time implementation fee for the capabilities required for the criteria outlined in this document. That may be bundled in the subscription fees depending on terms provided with the license.

A client may incur additional costs if it needs to connect with an EHR that does not meet national interoperability standards.

Third party fees related to the criteria listed above apply as described below and would be included in the terms provided with the license to be collected by Cantata Health Solutions

Criteria requiring Direct messaging use the third-party UpDox and may include per-site onetime and ongoing fees. The fees include Direct Domain Setup, Domain vetting and account setups. Fees start at 2 addresses per site, with additional addresses bundled in packs of 5.

Additional costs may be associated with the third party Dr. First. Dr. First supplies Cantata Health Solutions customers with electronic prescribing functionality.

American Medical Association fees will apply to the use of CPT® (Current Procedural Terminology) codes.
